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Lower School: Reception, Years 1 and 2

In Reception, we welcomed a very special guest, Azai's Mum, who taught us all about Diwali! She read us the story of Rama and Sita, explaining why Diwali is the festival of light. We made lanterns and special cards to celebrate the festival. Adam said, "My favourite part was the bad guy Ravana, he has ten heads!" Aadit said, "My favourite part of the story was when Sita was taken away." We have also started a new topic of 'Space', using the text 'Whatever Next' by Jill Murphy. The boys have enjoyed creating their own narratives with the space station and even made some creative looking aliens using the popoids and K'Nex. We have used our topic of Space in maths by using the 2D shapes to build rockets and aliens outside. Kieran said, "I have a big triangle, a square and little rectangle." Theo said, "I used lots of rectangles and squares to make my alien robot."



Our Reception boys are now benefiting from a 'free-flow' timetable where they are provided with the choice of playing inside or outside at different times during the day. Lots of the boys have taken this opportunity to invest in learning outside which has resulted in wonderful observations for their learning journeys. It has also allowed the boys opportunities to spend more time with their peers in the parallel class to develop and foster new friendships. You may like to ask your son this weekend which activities he enjoys during 'free-flow' time. Oli said, "I like free-flow because I get to choose!" Ashwin said, "I like it because I love to play outside!"

In Year 1, we have continued our English topic by using a familiar text to explore a range of characters and select appropriate adjectives to describe them. In history, we have continued with our topic of transport by learning about space travel. We learnt about the first moon landing and Bertie shared, "We had to decide if we thought the moon landing was real or fake, I think it is real because it was on TV, and they used a proper camera." Bertie also shared, "We learnt about old rockets, they looked more like a spaceship, now they are pointy at the top." Nolan said, "We learnt about a rocket that went the nearest to the sun, it exploded!" In maths we are applying our knowledge of subtraction by answering multi-step word problems. We have used number lines and ten frames to support and demonstrate subtraction. In Art, we have continued with our Diya pots and will now focus on painting them.

In Year 2, we have been continuing to look at addition and subtraction using a variety of methods. We were able to see which methods are the most efficient and have been challenging ourselves using numbers with a greater value. We have also enjoyed applying this mathematical knowledge by taking part in problem solving activities in small groups. In English, we have been continuing to immerse ourselves into our new text 'The Magic Finger' by Roald Dahl. We have been thinking about superpowers and what ones we would like to have and why. Alan said, "I would choose invisibility so that people couldn't always see me!" Philip E said, "I would choose a dragon superpower so I can talk to and understand dragons." We have also been preparing ourselves for writing a diary entry based on what we have read in the text so far. Ask us what the features of a diary entry are! In history, we have been introduced to our new topic 'The Gunpowder Plot'.

The boys have been deducing ideas from images and thinking about what clues various images can give us that relate to this significant event in history. In geography, we have been really excited to learn more about climate change. We were challenged to reflect upon what we already do for the environment and to think of ways in which we could be more environmentally friendly.

In art, we have continued to develop our artistic skill through our Nature project. We have been using string on cardboard to bring our abstract ideas to life and we will now focus on monochrome printing as another way of presenting our final designs.
